REGISTRATION

When enrollment in Philosophy Camp 2010 is approved by the instructor, John Wallace, your registration in the course Phil 4326—Lives Worth Living: Questions of Self, Vocation, and Community will be guaranteed. Course registration opens on Tuesday, **April 6** for degree-seeking students at the University of Minnesota and Tuesday, **April 13** for non-degree-seeking individuals and students enrolled at other institutions (all are welcome and eligible to register for May and Summer Session courses).

COST AND PAYMENT DUE

The cost of Philosophy Camp 2010 is an all-inclusive fee of \$2300. This fee includes a single occupancy room, meals, supplies, tuition, fees, and program supplies. A small amount of discretionary spending money is also generally needed for personal items.

The number of single and double rooms available will vary with student enrollment. If enrollment numbers require double-occupancy in some rooms, each student who shares a room will receive a \$200 refund. Student's room preferences will be honored in the order their acceptance to the program was confirmed.

The University will bill degree-seeking students at the University in early-June; the bill will be due on July 7. Students from other institutions may be asked to pay in full by the start of class.

Disclosure: Once your application is accepted for Philosophy Camp, should you decide not to register for Phil 4326 or you drop or withdraw from the course, you will still be charged for and will be responsible for paying \$500 of the program fee. Should Philosophy Camp (Phil 4326 and Phil 4350) not enroll enough registered students for the course to be held, you will owe nothing.
